III- Ministry Opportunities



<u>1-Mobile Medical Clinics</u> Missionaries will have the opportunity to serve alongside a team of medical professionals under the leadership of AEA's Medical Director, Dr. Romain Athus. We organize mobile clinics in

areas with limited access to medical facilities, in churches and/or school sites.

- We are especially in need of medical professionals (doctors, dentists, nurses, etc.) to operate the different aspects of the clinics.
- However, there will be plenty of opportunities for laypersons to assist with sorting and labeling medication. They may be trained to perform simple procedures such as blood sugar screening and assist in the pharmacy.









2-Children Ministries

AEA operates a free school for disadvantaged children. The school includes some who were displaced by the earthquake of Jan 12, 2010. There will be opportunities to interact with over 200 kids, organize VBS activities, craft, field day, etc.









We bring supplies of either clothes, toys, school supplies etc. for school kids and staff.

<u>3-Evangelical Outreach</u>

There will be opportunities to share the Gospel of Jesus-Christ with the people, pray for those with special medical needs beyond our means. We organize open air ministries in the evenings.

Transportation in Haiti

Transportation will be provided for you from the Airport in Port-au-Prince, Haiti to all the destinations and back to the Airport.

V- Lodging

Lodging will be provided at a pastor's home and church facilities. (If a group of 20 or more individuals group sign up before March 23, 2013, we may be able to secure lodging at a Baptist Retreat Center.)

VI- Cost of the Trip

The cost of the trip will consist primarily of the airfare and trip fee.

(i) Airfare

The cost of the round trip airfare to Port-au-Prince, Haiti currently ranges between $$600 \sim 800 , depending on how long in advance of the flight the ticket is purchased. The price is expected to increase over next few weeks. Therefore, we encourage all those traveling to purchase your ticket ASAP.

(ii) Trip Fees

To be determined... (minimum \$380 of to a maximum of \$525 per person. Based on lodging at a private home or at the Baptist Retreat Center). Fees to include

- Meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner)
- Afternoon at the beach
- Misc expenses (T-shirts and pertinent supplies for the trip.)

VII - Health Considerations

Dr. Romain Athus will publish the recommended immunization list shortly. You may consider visiting your personal doctor for guidance, if you have any doubt that your health may preclude you from traveling.

VIII - Consider Your Purpose for Going on the Mission Trip

A foreign mission trip can be an exciting opportunity to visit another country. However, a focus on the fun and leisure aspects of the trip can prove disappointing, since it can easily be eclipsed by the many glitches and sub-optimum accommodations to be found in a third world country. A heart of service is necessary for each missionary to be effective in serving others and to experience the abundant blessings that flow from God's throne to our hearts as we offer ourselves in service of the less fortunate. Therefore, please be prepared to be flexible and ready to sacrifice your own interests and comfort for the success of the mission trip.

Please recognize that there is a leadership team in charge of the mission trip. Please be prepared to support the leaders as they execute planned activities, as well as when the circumstances require deviations from established schedules. Your input is welcome. We will make time to discuss your questions and concerns, and make adjustments when it makes sense and is practical to do so. We expect both the leaders and the team members to have the glory of God and the success of the mission trip as their primary objective. We require everyone to be a team player and to be equipped with a Christ-like attitude.

Part - 2 - Personal Agreement and Guidelines

We expect everyone on the mission trip team to comply with the guidelines and requirements provided below. Please indicate your promise to comply by checking off each of the guidelines below and by signing the agreement at the place provided below.

As a member of the mission trip team, I promise to comply to the following guidelines for the safety,

effectiveness and success of the trip, and for the glory of God: 1. Follow the decisions of those in leadership. Express disagreement in civil and respectable manner. 2. Be respectful of the team and the local culture, as much as possible. Abstain from making derogatory comments about local cultures and congregations. 3. Acknowledge that by engaging in this journey, I am subjecting myself to certain risks voluntarily, including, but not limited to such things as health hazards due to poor food and water, diseases, pests, and poor sanitation, potential injury while working and inadequate medical facilities. 4. Affirm joyfully the standards of the local body of believers, particularly if their standards are stricter than my own, including areas of dress such as dress and shorts length, jeans, etc. 5. __ Not use tobacco, alcohol or illegal drugs during this ministry trip. 6. __ Refrain from complaining, gossiping, criticizing, and using obscene or insensitive language or humor. 7. __ Realize that any planned sightseeing and shopping will be permitted only if feasible; but could be canceled if not deemed convenient for travel, time, or if it hinders the flow of our ministry trip. 8. Remember that I have come to serve. I may come across procedures that I think are inefficient or attitudes that I find close-minded. However, I will be patient and open to learning other people's methods and ideas. 9. ___ Develop and maintain a submissive and cooperative attitude towards my teammates and others. 10. __ Not leave my assigned area of ministry or separate myself from my assigned group without first obtaining permission from the team leader or the group leader. 11. __ Abstain from any behavior or practice that is not conducive to basic Christian values and beliefs. 12. __ Not wear clothing that may be indecent or provocative (too short, too tight, too much cleavage), or clothing with inappropriate slogans. We may have the opportunity to go to a private beach. Please bring decent swimming shorts (guys) and decent One-Piece swimming suit (ladies), if you desire to swim. 13. __ Respect my fellow participants' right to privacy, possession and peace and quiet. 14. __ Be as flexible and open-minded as possible. 15. The philanthropic activities undertaken by Amour en Action are significant financial burdens. Though not required, we ask each trip participant to support the mission trip financially by raising funds from friends and family, and through fundraising drives.
